WATERFORD FISHERIES DISTRICT, (RIVER BARROW) ANGLING LIMITATION DURING SALMON SPAWNING RUN BYE-LAW NO. 1011, 2024

I, Eamon Ryan, Minister for the Environment, Climate and Communications, in exercise of the powers conferred on me by section 57 of the Inland Fisheries Act 2010 (No. 10 of 2010) (as adapted by the Communications, Climate Action and Environment (Alteration of Name of Department and Title of Minister) Order 2020 (S.I. No. 373 of 2020)), hereby make the following bye-law:

- 1. This Bye-law may be cited as the No. 3 or Waterford Fisheries District, (River Barrow) Angling Limitations during Salmon Spawning Run Bye-law No; 1011, 2024.
- 2. This Bye-law comes into operation on the day of its making.
- 3. This Bye-Law applies to that part of the waters of the River Barrow and of it's tributaries, in the No.3 or Waterford Fisheries District, that lie between, on the one hand, Maganey Bridge, in the townland of Grange in the County of Laois and in the townland of Maganey Lower in the County of Kildare and, on the other hand, Graiguecullen Bridge, in the townland of Graigue and in the townland of Carlow, both in the County of Carlow.

4.	It is prohibited for any person to take, catch or attempt to catch any fish, using any
means	, in angling with rod and line, in, on or from the waters referred to in Article 3, in the
period	from the 1st of October in any year to the 31st of January in the following year.
5.	Article 4 does not apply to any person using dead bait to fish with rod and line.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Bye-law and does not purport to be a legal interpretation).

This Bye-law prohibits any fishing for any type of fish in the defined waters of the River Barrow except angling with rod and line only using deadbait.

FOOTNOTE

Section 57 (7) of the Inland Fisheries Act, 2010 provides that any person aggrieved by this Bye-law may within 28 days after its publication in the Iris Oifigiúil, appeal against same to the High Court.
